# Local History, Museum Passes

## Worcester Art Museum

Founded in 1896, the Worcester Art Museum (WAM) is located at 55 Salisbury Street in Worcester and is a member of the Gale Free Library's Museum Pass program.

WAM's mission is to "connect people, communities, and cultures through the experience of art." The collection at the WAM contains nearly 38,000 objects including European and American art, Japanese prints documenting the history of printmaking in Japan, and Roman mosaics, including "The Hunt" mosaic which once covered the floor of a house in the ancient Roman city of Antioch. Currently on display for a limited time at WAM is *Rembrandt: Etchings from the Museum Boijmans Van Beuningen* and *Faith Ringgold: Freedom to Say What I Please*.

Other amenities at the WAM include a cafe and Museum shop. See their website at [worcesterart.org](http://worcesterart.org) for more information.

## Local History

With the passing years, the minutes of the Trustees of the Damon Memorial become more fascinating. For instance, ninety years ago the Trustees discussed, researched, and ultimately purchased interior\* electric lighting and installation services from the Coughlin [sic] Electric Co. Still in business, Coghlin Electric was only three years old when the Trustees approached them about electrifying the Damon.

Another major topic of research in 1913 was the "sanitary conditions" of the building. At the beginning of 1914, the Trustees voted to have their President provide the Town with their final report of "the estimated cost of flush closets, urinals, and the construction of a cess-pool [sic]." At the time, the occupants of the Damon Memorial still relied on the stone outhouse (now the Library's storage building), which was then attached to the back of the Damon.

Librarian Addie Holden had an annual salary of \$200.08 (roughly \$6,200 in 2023), and Custodian H. C. Damon, an annual salary of \$408.42 (roughly \$12,650 in 2023).

What follows are a few of the miscellaneous expenditures the Trustees approved ninety years ago:

"J. S. Wesby & Son, for binding books	45.05
Julian Benoit, for painting	45.35
F. F. Houghton & Co., for steam fitting and labor	22.73
H. H. Hoit, for making sign and expense	2.01
Office Equipment Co., for revolving bookcase	18.00
Putnam & Fales, for painting flagpole	5.00
Frost Stamp & Sta. Co., for repairing typewriter	1.50
J. W. Rice, for fertilizer	1.00
J. F. Henderson for repairing roof	3.00"

The Trustees also planned and held a formal 25th Anniversary of the Dedication of the Damon Memorial on August 29, 1913.

*\*Exterior lighting for the Damon was a Town matter.*

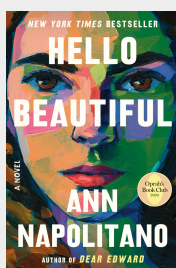
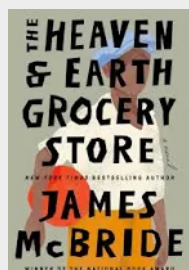
