

Black Bear Happenings in NH







Nature Corner: Dynamic Tree
Nesting Ducks - Part 1

On a recent hike near a pond in Maine, we were delighted to see the dramatic

display of a Hooded Merganser performing a courtship ritual to attract a female. Hooded Mergansers are diving ducks that use their thin, serrated bills to both catch and hold on to their prey. They dine primarily on crustaceans, fish and insects in shallow ponds, streams and wetlands. During courtship, the males raise their white crests, shaking their heads and expanding the crest patch into a striking pompadour. The male then throws back his head touching his back, crest raised, while croaking like a frog to complete his elaborate efforts to attract a mate. This courtship ritual continued for a while, but eventually the male was rewarded and a female came swimming over to join him.
