Nature Corner: Are Daffodils

Narcissus or Narcissistic?

Daffodils, (a.k.a. Narcissus) are a welcome harbinger of spring with their beautiful, bright yellow blooms. So many poets have written about their beauty, that they are also known as the "Poet's Flower". Being narcissistic has a negative connotation (having an excessive interest in oneself and one's physical appearance), so how did these joyful flowers get their name?



Narcissus, from Greek mythology, was a hunter who was renowned for his extraordinary beauty. His story tells how he fell in love with his own reflection and became obsessed with it, not realizing its origin. Some versions of the myth tell how he beat his chest in absolute agony thinking he was being kept apart from his beloved, fell into the water and drowned. One version of the myth is that in his place, a flower bloomed, bearing his name Narcissus.
