
Want to foster your child's interest in STEM? Come to the library as we host **ImagArena for the Buildwave:** A hands-on building game!





## History Room

Presents: EDWARD HITCHCOCK: AMERICA'S FIRST DINOSAUR EXPERT with Bob McMaster



February 11, 2023 at 11:00 AM in the Community Room

EDWARD
HITCHCOCK was one of
19th-century America's
most eminent scientists. He
was the first American
scientist to publicly embrace
the theory of continental
glaciation, but he is better
known for his landmark
research on what he called

the "fossil footmarks" of the Connecticut Valley. No biography had been written of him until 2021, when *All the Light here Comes from Above: The Life and Legacy of Edward Hitchcock* was published by retired HCC biology professor Bob McMaster. In his presentation, Bob will review the life of Edward Hitchcock, his legacy as a scientist, and his role in the early development of Mount Holyoke College, Amherst College, and the UMass Amherst.

ROBERT T. MCMASTER has advanced degrees from Boston College, Smith College, and the University of Massachusetts. He taught biology at Holyoke Community College from 1994 to 2014. Besides his biography of Edward Hitchcock, he has authored the Trolley Days Series, four novels set in Holyoke in the World War I era, and *Rose of Glenkerry: A County Wicklow Mystery*, a contemporary novel set in Ireland.

## COVID Vaccine and Testing Sites - Holyoke

#### **GET YOUR COVID 19 VACCINE**

Everyone, individuals age 75 and older, individuals age 60 and older, individuals with 2+ certain medical conditions, residents and staff of low income and affordable senior housing, K-12 educators, K-12 school staff, and child care workers are especially recommended to get the COVID-19 vaccine and boosters.

Pre-Register for the Vaccine by going to the Mass.gov Covid-19 website or call 211 for help registering.

#### Get free COVID test kits at HOME

There's a federal resource to get free FDA-authorized Coronavirus test kits. At <u>COVIDtests.gov</u>, you'll find information about testing and a link to the U.S. Postal Service – <u>special.usps.com/testkits</u> – where you can order up to four rapid tests to be sent to your home address. **Or order your kits by calling 1-800-232-0233 (TTY 1-888-720-7489).** Your kits will be mailed through the U.S. Postal Service within 7 to 12 days.

The tests are completely free. There are no shipping costs, and you don't have to give a credit card or bank account number. You only need to give a name and address. Once you place an order, you'll get an order confirmation number. If you give your email address, you'll also get an order confirmation email and delivery updates. Anyone who asks for more information than that is a scammer.
