

Read the Story of the Holyoke Public Library


We scoured the archives to put together this brief history of the Library from its beginnings in 1870 to the 21st century. Enjoy!



Rediscover Your Holyoke Public Library-Reference/Information for All

The Holyoke Library observed 100 years of library service to the residents of the "Paper City" in 1970. At that time, library staff assisted library users in finding information in person, via phone and mail using numerous books in the library collection.

The turning point in providing information came with the new millennium – around 2000. At that time, "online" resources gradually supplemented the old way of researching for information. Card catalogues were thrown out!

Today, library users can research any topic of interest by going "online" at home or at the library where staff are still needed to assist Patrons.
