


#### **Grab & Go Kits**


## Now, 2020 is finally over but the Celebration continues!

- From mobile devices, download the <u>PrinterOn</u> <u>App</u> from <u>Google Play</u> or <u>Apple App Store</u>. Search for Holyoke, MA. Select Holyoke Browsing Printer. Follow directions.
- Then, once your documents are Sent to be printed at the library, call or email to pick them up via Curbside Service. (See Above)

## Beware of Phone Scammers!

Millions of Americans, including the Holyoke library have been the victims of a new phone scam and it's increasing every year. It's called spoofing.

**Spoofing** is when a caller deliberately falsifies the information transmitted to your caller ID display to disguise their identity. Scammers often use neighbor spoofing so it appears that an incoming call is coming from a local number, or from a company or a government agency like the Holyoke Library that you may already know and trust.

If you think you've been the victim of a spoofing scam, you can <u>file a complaint with the FCC</u>. Check out this info from the FCC has on how to deal with scams like <u>Caller ID Spoofing</u>.

# COVID Testing Sites - Holyoke

STOP THE SPREAD TESTING SITES EXTENDED TESTING THROUGH March 31<sup>ST</sup>

WALK UP COVID-19 Testing Site in Holyoke A walk-up COVID testing site opened in Holyoke at 323 Appleton St. Testing hours are Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 2pm to 6pm. Testing will run until 3/31/21.

DRIVE UP COVID-19 Testing Site in Holyoke
A Stop the Spread test has opened at Holyoke
Community College. Testing will run until 3/31/21.

A map with the new traffic pattern and testing site location is posted on the <u>Holyoke Board of Health</u> website.

The testing will remain at HCC, but now takes place at Lot H. Hours and days of operation:

- The site will operate Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday 7am 11am. Tuesday and Thursday 2pm -7pm.
- Turnaround time for results is typically 4 days or fewer.
