

"A PEDDLER'S PACK OF SPOOKY TALES FROM HILL AND VALLEY: VINTAGE STORIES FROM YOUR GRANDPARENTS FIRESIDE"

Our story teller- Dennis D. Picard has been a museum professional in the living history field for forty years. He began his career in 1978 at *Old Sturbridge Village* and spent twelve years filling various positions including lead interpreter, where he researched and designed many public programs which are still offered by that institution today. He recently retired after 27 years at *Storrowton Village Museum*, in West Springfield.

While researching in town records, journals, and old newspapers Dennis was surprised at finding stories of the supernatural. Tales of witches, vampires and weird occurrences are mixed in with otherwise mundane daily records. Picard has saved these stories in his files and will share some of his favorites.

- From mobile devices, download the <u>PrinterOn</u> <u>App</u> from <u>Google Play</u> or <u>Apple App Store</u>. Search for Holyoke, MA. Select Holyoke Browsing Printer. Follow directions.
- Then, once your documents are Sent to be printed at the library, call or email to pick them up via Curbside Service. (See Above)



## \* Wi-Fi Hotspot Lending

We have 5 Hotspot Devices to Loan!

In fulfilling the Library's mission to provide access to educational resources, the Holyoke Public Library has established a **Wi-Fi Hotspot Lending Program** to assist patrons needing Internet access <u>for a limited time</u>. The intention program is to provide Internet access for

- Students to use for help with remote learning
- Patrons to search and apply for jobs
- Workers to travel with internet for meetings
- Patrons to have access to the library's digital resources such as our databases, eBooks, etc.

The "Wi-Fi Hotspot Kit" consists of a mobile wireless hotspot device, as well as its cable, charger, and case.

#### \*\* TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

To borrow a Hotspot Kit, patrons must be 18 years of age or older and have a Holyoke Public Library card (in good standing -- i.e. library card is not blocked due to unpaid fines or lost material). - Call ahead to reserve a kit. At checkout, Library staff will confirm that all items are present in the hotspot kit. The patron must sign the Library's Hotspot Lending Program Rules and Agreement before checking out. Only one hotspot kit may be borrowed on a patron's account/per household at any given time.

The <u>loan period</u> for the Hotspot Kits are three (3) days or 14 days with no grace period.

\*This does not include lost book/item fees. Just bring your donation to the front desk with you library card before putting it in the donation box for credit.

The Holyoke Library is proud to be working with Margaret's Pantry on 56 Cabot St to collect food for our neighbors. Margaret's Pantry provides food for 3 meals and 3 snacks for 4 days a week to those in need. 2020 saw a large increase in food requests.

WALK UP COVID-19 Testing Site is now open at the War Memorial at 310 Appleton St.
M, W, F from 2pm-6pm. Line starts at front door.

\*Drive up Testing will run until 12/31/21.

DRIVE UP COVID-19 Testing Site in Holyoke Holyoke Community College - 303 Homestead Ave. Testing will run until 12/31/21.

A map with the new traffic pattern and testing site location is posted on the <u>Holyoke Board of Health</u> <u>website</u>. The testing takes place at Lot M near the Bartley Center. Hours and days of operation:

- Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday 7am 11am. Tuesday and Thursday 2pm -7pm.
- Turnaround time is typically 4 days or fewer.
- This test site is first come, first serve. There are no appointments. To help speed up the process, please have your information ready.
