Special Collections Room (materials do not circulate)

- Rare and unique books pertaining to Jacksonville and Morgan County
- Local History Vertical Files: includes newspaper clippings, event programs, photographs, and other assorted materials on people, places, events and topics pertaining to Jacksonville

City Directories (1866-Present)

- Search by last name or business name to link individuals to specific properties
- Search by street address to discover the individuals who have lived in or operated from a specific property

Newspaper Microfilm (1830s-Present)

- Obituaries, birth announcements, news coverage of special events (weddings, graduations, deaths, family disputes, etc.)
- Partial obituary index exists covering 1976-1996
