Spring Book Sale

Many book lovers were waiting when our (non-existent) doors opened at 10 a.m. to get the best possible selection of our donated books. Book browsing on a spring day—what could be better?



Once again the weather gods smiled on the Friends of the Library as we held our semi-annual book sale on a beautiful Saturday, May 13. Once again, the people of Bourne brought literally a ton of books during our short two-hour donation window. And once again astute shoppers turned up to buy almost new, hardback bestsellers for \$2.00.

To put all this together, we had a record number of Friends volunteers. When new Assistant Director Colleen Callaghan came in early to open the building for us, these volunteers pulled tables from the community room outside, lined them up, and filled them with large-print books and children's books. New tables donated by Kathy Fox Alfano supplemented our rather beat-up and heavy old tables, but all were put to use because of the huge number of donated books.

Horticulturalist Paul Split was there was again as a special guest, bringing free seed packets and even sprouted tomato seedlings to give away, along with his gardening advice honed over his long career.

And once again, students from Bourne High School's field hockey team and National Honor Society brought their energy and strength to the most challenging part of the day, setting up the whole sale in under two hours.

The end result was that the book sale netted \$1,934, considerably more than last year. Treasurer's Report



Oh boy! It is time to celebrate warmer weather, blossoms and books. The Friends are about one-third of the way into the Budget year. To date we have funded fifteen programs and renewed seven museum passes.

The Friends Budget is funded 70% from an endowment and 30% from dues, donations and fund raising. Your support allows us to provide many free events to the community.

Managing the endowment fund is a responsibility taken very seriously by the Board. This fund is currently invested in a conservatively arrayed mix of stocks. The Board is considering whether \ to shift the portfolio to a ESG (Environment, Social, Governance) mix of stocks. As ESG rated company is one that factors their financial decisions with concern for the environment and social equity. They are governed with transparent ethical practices.



Some books are more valuable than others. This we all know. Every time books are donated, a small percentage of them may have a higher resale value on eBay.

The Friends are seeking a Volunteer to manage an <u>eBay Book Sale program</u>. If you have time and are willing to help, we would be thrilled!

Here is how the program would work.

At each Book Sale, members of The Friends would sort out potential books for resale.

The Volunteer would check each book on eBay and see what its listed value is. Books with a value less then \$25 would be returned to the next Book Sale.

Books with a greater value would be listed. The Volunteer would photograph the book, determine a competitive price, and list it for sale in a Friends eBay account.

Once sold, the Volunteer would package and mail the book. Mailing costs would be paid by the Friends.


