Our New Pollinator Garden

Last year as patrons drove up to the Library they could see the freshened face of the brickwork on the front of our nearly 100-year-old building. This summer, thanks to the Bourne Garden Club, the front of the Library is also graced with a new garden, blooming with plants and flowers native to the area. These are pollinator plants—107 of them—chosen for their ability to attract and sustain the bee population on which we all depend. Come view the asters, coneflowers, bleeding



heart, bee balm, and more, and perhaps you will take home some ideas for your home garden. Many thanks to the knowledgeable and generous-spirited members of the Garden Club who made this native garden that greets library patrons daily this summer.

Treasurer Still Needed!

Since our treasurer Pat Nemeth resigned last year to move to a new home, that role has been filled well on a temporary basis by Bill Prodouz. However, we need someone to step up to take on the responsibilities of the treasurer on a more permanent basis.

The treasurer's main focus is working with library leadership to pay for programs, museum passes and other events sponsored by the Friends. These are the basic responsibilities:

- The treasurer provides checks and credit cards as needed to pay for library programs.
- The treasurer deposits cash and checks received; the majority of this comes from two time periods: membership renewals and the Season of Giving auction. Banking can be in-person or through online deposits.
- The treasurer keeps records of transactions via Excel Spreadsheets, which are already created and linked.
- The treasurer prepares a monthly report; a template for this is available.
- The treasurer reviews finances, including banking and investment performance, with the President and Board.

The highlight of the evening was a performance of "The Unicorn," a song written by Shel Silverstein and recorded by The Irish Rovers. Led by Denye, children in the audience danced to the song and made arm gestures that reflected "green alligators and long-necked geese,/ some



humpty-backed camels and some chimpanzees." (Sadly, though, the unicorns didn't make it onto Noah's ark.)

Summer Concert Series: Scott Ouellette

July 30 was another fine evening in the Summer Garden as the Library presented Scott Ouellette, a classical guitarist who has performed here in Bourne before. A gifted musician, he plays music from the Baroque era and from Spain, Spanish-speaking America, and Brazil. Summer Reading Kickoff




