

January 24 - I Capture the Castle by Dodie Smith






July 25 - Writers and Lovers by Lily King


February 28- Purple Hibiscus by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie

Born in the same hospital on the same day, Eric and Morgan grow up together as best friends, through six years of birthdays they discover who they are meant to be, and if they are meant to be together.




August 22 - The Midnight Library by Matt Haig






June 27 - The Poacher's Son by Paul Doiron

his father is to find the real killer-putting everyone he loves in the line


