


have the opportunity to sample all of the dishes! Space is limited to ensure that there are enough goodies to go around. Please call or <u>e-mail</u> the library to register.

Nonfiction Book Group - August 12

Join us on Monday, August 12 at 6:30 p.m. to discuss *Educated* by Tara Westover.

A girl claws her way out of a claustrophobic, violent fundamentalist family into an elite academic career in this searing debut memoir. Westover recounts her upbringing with six siblings on an Idaho farm dominated by her father Gene (a pseudonym), a devout Mormon with a paranoid streak who tried to live off the grid, kept four children (including the author) out of school, refused to countenance doctors (Westover's mother, Faye, was an unlicensed midwife who sold



homeopathic medicines), and stockpiled supplies and guns for the end-time. Westover was forced to work from the age of 11 in Gene's scrap and construction businesses under incredibly dangerous conditions; the grisly narrative includes lost fingers, several cases of severe brain trauma, and two horrible burns that Faye treated with herbal remedies. Thickening the dysfunction was the author's bullying brother, who physically brutalized her for wearing makeup and other immodest behaviors. When she finally escaped the toxic atmosphere of dogma, suspicion, and patriarchy to attend college and then grad school at Cambridge, her identity crisis precipitated a heartbreaking rupture. Westover's vivid prose makes this saga of the pressures of conformity and self-assertion that warp a family seem both terrifying and ordinary. (Publishers Weekly, vol 264, issue 50)

They will describe the rich history and culture of "The Way," offer suggestions based on their own experience on how to prepare for walking for two months carrying nothing more than what's in your small backpack, what equipment and clothing are needed and suggestions about eating, sleeping and the pilgrimage experience.

The writers, longtime friends and mystery-writing colleagues, both have recent additions to their Maine series.


Random Act is the 12th in Boyle's popular series featuring Jack McMorrow - ex-New York Times reporter-turned- small town Maine newspaper editor-turned-freelance writer. Boyle began his writing career in newspapers, in what he calls "the best training ground ever." After graduating from Colby College - and short-term jobs from roofer to manuscript reader at a New York City publishing house - his first reporting job was at the weekly *Rumford Falls Times*, later moving on to the *Waterville Morning Sentinel*. It was on the news beat that he began collecting material for his first McMorrow novel, *Deadline*, published in 1993. He hasn't stopped writing about Maine (or living here) since. Indeed, reviewers have already called *Random Act* "his best."

Lawyer- turned-writer and a former Maine Assistant Attorney General, Flora is the owner of two series. Her newest is, *A Child Shall Lead*, the sixth in a series with Portland Police Department detective-sergeant Joe Burgess. Her earlier series, now up to nine books, features Thea Kozak, an educational consultant. Equally at home with nonfiction, Flora is the author of *Finding Amy: A True Story of Murder in Maine* (with Joseph K. Loughton); *Death Dealer: How Cops and Cadaver Dogs Brought a Killer to Justice; A Good Man with a Dog* (with Roger Guay); and *Shots Fired: The Misconceptions, Misunderstandings, and Myths About Police Shootings* (with Joseph K. Loughlin).

Adult Book Discussion - August 27

Join us on Tuesday, August 27 at 1:00 p.m. to discuss *Before We Were Yours* by Lisa Wingate.

Christy and Carol Award-winning Wingate (The Story Keeper; The Sea Glass Sisters) weaves a complex tale about two families, two generations apart, linked by an injustice, based on a notorious true-life scandal. The story begins in 1939 when Rill Foss and her four younger siblings, who had been happily living on their parents' shantyboat on the Mississippi, are seized by strangers and taken to a Memphis orphanage. In present-day South Carolina, the Staffords, a wealthy and prestigious family deeply immersed in the political realm, takes center



stage when Avery returns home to help her father recuperate from a health crisis. There she experiences a chance encounter with a resident at the nursing home, which leads to her investigating her family's history. As secrets are exposed, the question is raised: Are some things better left hidden in the past, or is it best to have everything out in the open? (Library Journal, vol 142, issue 6, p80)




