Starting Friday, November 27, you can pick up your materials via curbside: Mondays and Fridays: 1:00 p.m. to 4:45 p.m. Wednesdays: 4:00 p.m. to 7:45 p.m. Please stay tuned for official reopening schedule.

We are getting a wonderful upgrade! On Friday, November 27, we will begin the process of **installing new carpeting** on the entire upper level. This is a several step project that involves moving all of our materials and furniture to make the floor accessible. During this time in-person services will be unavailable. However, you can still utilize our curbside service on Mondays, Wednesday, and Fridays and our book drop will continue to be open for returns 24/7. Our adult and young adult collections will be unavailable to request at this time but you will still be able to request children's items and interlibrary loans.

We plan to resume six day per week services on Monday, December 14. In the meantime, we encourage you take advantage of our new video-streaming offering, <u>Kanopy</u>, or our e-book and e-audiobook platforms <u>OverDrive</u> and <u>CloudLibrary</u>.




## In Stitches - December 1, 8, 15, 22, 29



Participants will need access to an internet enabled computer or device with camera and microphone that can be used near a workspace.

## Virtual Take-and-Make - December 14


Pamper yourself for the holidays! At this month's virtual take-and-make program, you'll learn to make your own foot cream and face toner. How does it




#### **Teen Gaming**

This month, I checked out Kanopy, our library's new video streaming service. I found it easy to sign up for the service and navigate through the site. I didn't have a title in mind, so I liked how films were browsable by categories. I was happy to find the Short Film category, for example. I also found it helpful that I could add videos to "My List" and then later choose one from that list to watch. The first video I selected was *Dear Mr. Shakespeare*. At only 6 minutes in length, this Sundance-nominated short film is truly short, but I was really glad I used one of my seven monthly credits to view this carefully crafted exploration of race, immigration, blackness, Shakespeare, and *Othello*. The poetry and performances were hypnotic, and I therefore watched the film several times, which was easy to do since each Kanopy film can be viewed an unlimited number of times for three days after hitting play. I'm looking forward to my next film-find on Kanopy, and I invite you to contact the library if you have any questions about this new service.

## Krissy, Library Assistant

#### Piranesi by Susanna Clarke

This poetic, thoughtful book instantly won my heart over with the strength of its narrator. It is not a book that tells you all or even most of the information right away, instead leaving the reader to put together clues as to what and where and when and why the events are happening (reminiscent of the way *Room* by Emma Donoghue is structured). I often find this type of book frustrating, but I did not mind it here. The narrator has an infectious sense of wonder and joy at new discoveries, and I found myself excited to learn more about the House not just because I wanted to know what was happening, but also because I wanted him to learn the answers to all his questions.

At times heartwarming, at times chill-inducing, this book always manages to be fascinating and draw you in. Yes, there is a mystery to uncover, but I found it was a book more to savor than to speed-read. It will sit with you long after you put it down.
