



### A Book, Documentary and Community Conversation



### **India Travel Lectures**

Cornelia Stockman of Kennebunk Portside Rotary will be speaking at Kennebunk Free Library about her recent travels in India. Cornelia will discuss family values, cultural pride, customs and water provisions among many other topics. Cornelia's perspective and photos will honor the way of life in the communities she lived in and worked with while in India. Several articles of clothing and artifacts will also be on display.



On Wednesday, June 8th (6:00 PM) Cornelia will talk about the first week of the trip, in Bikaner, visiting projects school the experiencing family life with the people she stayed with. 14 Bikaner schools received Rotary International Global Grant - the education of the youth and the benefits to the schools and villages that shared the grant will be covered.

On Wednesday, June 15th (6:00 PM) she will cover her last week in

the eastern state of Mewat where immunizations against the Polio virus were given to children. Additionally she will talk about the water project she worked on and the living situation in the hills.

### Forgetting Tabitha - Book Discussion

On Saturday, **June 4** at 1:00 Julie Dewey will be discussing her book *Forgetting Tabitha*. Raised on a farm, Tabitha Salt, the daughter of Irish Immigrants, leads a bucolic and sheltered existence. When tragedy strikes the family, Tabitha and her mother are forced to move to the notorious Five Points District in New York City, known for its brothels, gangs, gambling halls, corrupt politicians, and thieves. As they struggle to survive in their new living conditions, tragedy strikes again. Young Tabitha resorts to life alone on the streets of New York, dreaming of a happier future.

Julie Dewey is a novelist residing in Central New York with her family. Julie selects book topics that are little known nuggets of U.S. history and sheds light on them so that the reader not only gets an intriguing story line but learns a little something too.

### KFL's Genealogy Group

The Kennebunk Free Library Genealogy Group will host



mapmaker, Connie Brown, on **Saturday, June 11** at 10:00 AM. She will take the audience step-by-step through the challenges of a recent genealogical map and show historical migration maps that describe three genealogical projects in which she is currently involved.

It takes special-and sometimes additional-data to delineate genealogy

spatially. Cartographic rendering of genealogy requires not just all the research you've done about your ancestors, but also the particular location-based data you need in order to trace migration or movement. Connie will also describe how she has resolved these challenges in mapping the geography of genealogy.

For twenty-five years, Connie Brown has painted one-of-a-kind wall maps on canvas for private clients, companies, and organizations. She maps travel routes, life histories, genealogies, properties, historic and environmental regions, and various thematic topics. Among her current projects is a probono stewardship/fund-raising map about African elephants; the beneficiary



is Kenya's David Sheldrick Wildlife Trust. Her company, Redstone Studios, has been featured in many publications


