Wreath Sale

It is a bit early to be thinking of wreaths, but we want to let you know that KFL will be selling Maine-made wreaths and centerpieces and you won't want to miss buying one! <u>Wreaths of Maine</u> in Waldoboro create beautifully handmade, double-sided 24" Balsam wreaths, centerpieces and sprays that will adorn your

front door, and will also make excellent gifts.

We will begin accepting orders in October from individuals and businesses; the wreaths will be delivered to the library for pick up on Sat., Nov. 28th.

These are the same wreaths, sprays and centerpieces that Kennebunk High School has sold in the past. If you have purchased them from the school, then you already know of their high quality. Wreaths of Maine uses Balsam fir to make double sided wreaths-because it is plentiful and it smells so good! Wreaths measure two feet across which is a perfect size for the front door. Each one is hand made by a skilled wreath-maker. The wreaths are then decorated just as they appear in the picture, except for the bow which is placed in the center to prevent it from crushing. The wreaths are delivered in decorative boxes using the fastest delivery possible, so wreaths arrive fresh. They come with a personalized gift card and a hanger is attached. For an additional fee, wreaths can be shipped. Prices vary and range between \$25.75 and \$36.25

Melissa has a B.A. in Russian Language and Eastern European Studies from Boston University (2009) and was a Peace Corps Volunteer from October 2009 to December 2011 in the Salvan region of Azerbaijan. "I taught English in village schools in the region; however, I consider my secondary project at the Salyan Central Library the most rewarding aspect of my Peace Corps service. I have seen firsthand how a library can transform a community and empower young people. I also advocated for library services with local government officials and teachers. This experience demonstrated to me the wide range of services a library can provide, and how libraries are an important community resource especially for young people." Melissa graduated with a Master's of Library Science degree from Texas Woman's University (2014) and has three years of experience working with young people in a library setting, and nearly 8 years of experience teaching English as a Second Language at all levels to children and adults. An additional feather in her cap is that she was recently appointed to YALSA's Teen Read Week Planning Committee (2015-2017).
