

Our September exhibition is "Discovering Italy", the photographs of Enrico Della Pietra depicting a journey across Italy, visiting some of its lesserknown landmarks and fascinating sites.

Enrico Della Pietra is an Italian photographer, born and raised in Naples, Italy who has recently relocated to Maine. His photography skills were acquired through courses at Accademia Creativia in Naples, Italy. He spent over 15 years of his photographic development embracing the European and Italian styles of capturing street photography and human character. This pathway led him to participate at the 2014

Magnum Photos Masterclass under the expert hand of photographer Patrick Zachmann. He has received several awards, such as the MIFA (Moscow International Photo Award) and the Gran Prix de la Photographie in Paris, France.

Enrico has exhibited his works in Art Festivals throughout the United States, a country which continues to offer inspiration for his art. Now, as a new resident to the Southern Maine area, his enduring fascination with the historic and dominant Biddeford Mill propelled him to launch his photography studio right within its walls. Enrico is anxious to engage with Mainers, who have been the source of much encouragement and motivation throughout the past decade.


Annual Trustee Meeting
