No reservations are accepted. Sign up begins at 9 AM with a sign-in sheet on our front door.

### Tax Forms

KFL provides copies of some of the most frequently used IRS tax forms. The state of Maine is not providing state tax forms to the Library—copies are available to patrons only by calling (207/624-7894), writing your requests (mail to: Maine Revenue Services, SHS 24, Augusta, ME 04333-0024) or ordering online

(www.maine.gov/revenue/forms/FormsReq\_form.html). You may also download forms from the Maine government website: www.maine.gov/revenue/forms/homepage.html. Kennebunk Library offers its computers for downloading these forms for a 25¢ per page fee. KFL Staff can help you download forms from the internet; however, we cannot help you with your tax related questions.
