April's Heart, a movie made by the Sanford High School Film Club, will be shown at KFL on Wed., Feb. 2nd at 6 PM. The Film Club, with the support of Gum Spirits Productions, led the year-long effort in making this film. The Club started with some powerful guestions: Do we really know teenagers? What is behind the faces we see every day? How are kids hurting? To get answers, they offered every young person in school the opportunity to submit anonymous true stories as ideas for concepts, story lines and ultimately the script.

The film reveals April, a shy observer in a small town high school. She watches and listens while her peers survive teenage chaos. Can she find her place in the cliquey, unforgiving halls of the high school, or will she stay safe and alone on the outside? April's Heart tears the mask off of young people so we can see inside—a story that gives an intimate look at the challenges. hopes and dreams of American teenagers.
