

Groundbreaking...Mushrooms

Mushrooms for health with Greg Marley Tues. July 16 at 6:30 PM

Most of us were taught as young children to never eat the wild mushrooms that we stumbled across while wandering through the woods or our back yards. But Maine has a variety of wild mushrooms, many of which are edible or have medicinal value. Taking advantage of this abundant natural resource means developing the knowledge to distinguish the helpful mushrooms from the harmful ones. On **Tues. July 16 at 6:30 PM**, mushroom expert Greg Marley will be at the KFL to discuss understanding that difference.

Marley is the founder of <u>Mushrooms for Health</u>, a company that provides mushroom education and products made with Maine medicinal mushrooms. To introduce people to the fun of mushrooming, he frequently lectures, teaches classes, and leads guided walks. Marley is the author of many books including *Mushrooms for Health; Medicinal Secrets of Northeastern Fungi and The Love, Lore* and *Mystique of Mushrooms*, in addition to an e-mail newsletter and numerous journal articles. He also volunteers as a mushroom identification consultant to poison control centers across New England.

If you were one of the many people who read and enjoyed <u>Silent Spring</u>, now learn a little bit about the fascinating woman who wrote it and the circumstances surrounding its publication. On **Thurs. July 18 at 1 PM** and again on **Wed. July 24 at 6:30 PM**, KFL will be showing the documentary "Rachel Carson's Silent Spring."

Part of PBS's <u>American Experience</u> series, this hour-long documentary tells us a bit about the life of the author and the mania that followed the release of Silent Spring.

The chemical industry in the 1960s labeled Carson "an ignorant and hysterical woman." But she also had supporters in a number of prominent politicians. The movie explores the disparate perspectives on the author and what drove her to write the book, knowing in advance how polarizing it would be.




Groundbreaking...Travel

If you spend any time driving around the back roads of New England, you can't help but notice the stone walls, in various states of repair, covering the landscape. Have you ever wondered how they came to be such a common sight? Why and how were they built? Kevin Gardner will visit KFL on **July 30 at 6:30 PM** to answer those questions and more.




Gardner has worked for nearly 40 years as a stone wall builder in a family business that specializes in the restoration of antique walls and other structures. He is the author of <u>The Granite Kiss: Traditions and Techniques of Building New England Stone Walls.</u> In his presentation,

Gardner will discuss many of the topics mentioned in his book, including how New England's stone walls were built and how styles changed through the years. As he speaks, he will build a miniature rock wall. Following the presentation, audience members will be given the opportunity to ask questions about their own projects.
