Minerva News



KFL joined the MINERVA consortium of Maine libraries on Thursday, June 26 after years of patiently waiting for new libraries to be accepted and a month of intense preparation.

During the first three weeks of June, over 54 KFL supporters volunteered over 420 hours assisting library staff in affixing new barcodes on nearly 45,000 items and converted their records accordingly. Our library's MINERVA catalog is now available via our website, and with a new library card patrons can search the catalogs of over 60 other public, private and collegiate libraries and request items for delivery here at KFL. The transition has not been without its bumps and dips and we truly appreciate our community's patience as our technical difficulties have been worked through and staff ramps up to new screens and processes.



Astronomy Nights

We are pleased to offer three "Astronomy Nights" at KFL as part of KFL's summer reading program. The Kennebunk-basedAstronomical Society of Speers Gallery and the Maine Northern New England (ASNNE) is an all-volunteer non-profit educational Children's Book Illustrators Gallery organization founded to promote public awareness of astronomy. In keeping will be open to the public from 5-8 with our Summer Literary Elements theme, two of its members will present a PM on Fri., July 18. On Tues., July 8 at 6:30 PM, Ian T. Durham will present a program on the planet Uranus and its moons, all 27 of which are named after characters in Shakespeare or the works of Alexander Pope. Ian is Associate Professor and Chair of the Dept. of Physics and Director of the Computational Physical Sciences program at Saint Anselm College in Manchester, NH. His research focuses on quantum information, complexity theory, the foundations of quantum mechanics and

cosmology, and anything else that piques his interest. He is a member of the Foundational Questions Institute and serves as secretary /treasurer of the American Physical Society's Topical Group on Quantum Information. He has been a member of the Kennebunk-based ASNNE for 13 years. He lives in Kennebunk with his wife, kids, and dog where he enjoys fly fishing and other pursuits in his spare time.

On Tues., July 15 and Tues., July 22 at 6:30 PM, Carl Gurtman will present "Measuring the Heavens - From Ancient Times on". Carl has been interested in astronomy since his earliest years. He is currently a Director of ASNEE. Carl is also interested in vexillology, the study of flags, bicycling, running, & tennis. He retired as the Assistant Nuclear Engineering & Planning Manager after a 37-year career at the Portsmouth Naval Shipyard. He and his wife Linda, also retired, live in York, and have three adult children, and four grandsons, four and under.
