

KFL now offers a Tween Advisory Board which meets every other month. The hour-long meetings, for students in grades 6-8, occur the first Tuesday of every other month. During alternate months, the Teen Advisory Board for high school students in grades 9-12 meets.

What exactly is a tween? Current usage denotes a youngster between the ages of ten and twelve who is considered too old to be a child and too young to be a teenager. A tween is "between" the age of childhood and teenager. In the US, tween culture is thriving. Stores, television stations, movies, and music are specifically geared to this population. It is important for public libraries to recognize this unique demographic and to provide a collection and services that address their needs.

In light of this, the purpose of KFL's Tween Advisory Board is to promote tweens' participation in the library's activities, as well as interest in the library in general. Working together with the Teen Librarian, the Board works to maintain a collection that reflects the unique needs of tweens. Our goal is to unite tweens with books, make reading enjoyable, and provide a safe and fun environment for tweens.
