WWII Veteran & Maine Author at KFL



Octogenarian Dick Goodie has just published his third book, *Raindrops on a Nail Keg.* He will appear at KFL **on October 4th at 1 PM.** The book, a compilation of short stories, relates over a dozen graphic, eyewitness narratives recounting his exploits in Europe as a young combat soldier during World War II. Many essays in the book have been recently written and several essays tell of adventures shared with his wife and two daughters after the war.

At the age of 19 Goodie was drafted into the US Army and was shipped on the Queen Mary to Great Britain at the end of 1943. The threat of German U-Boats was ever-present during the voyage; he later learned that had the U-Boats been successful, there were not nearly enough life boats to save the over 15,000 troops on board. Goodie served as a squad leader in the storied 3rd Armored Division, from Normandy, France to Central Germany and earned five Campaign Stars.

Dick Goodie was born in Bangor, Maine, educated at Portland Junior College, the University of Denver, by Life's experiences, and by reading innumerable books along the way. He lives in Westbrook with his wife Joyce. His books will be available for purchase and signing.
