Bag It—the Movie

Kennebunk's Energy Efficiency Advisory Committee is hosting a screening of the new, award-winning environmental documentary Bag It: Is Your Life Too Plastic? at KFL on Tues. Oct. 30, at 6:30 PM. "Gripping, funny, intelligent and sure to change your life." -Louie Psihoyos, Director of The Cove

Did you know that the average American uses about 500 plastic bags each year, for about twelve minutes each? This single-use habit has led to the formation of a floating island of plastic debris in the Pacific Ocean more than twice the size of Texas. Film director Suzan Beraza had made a simple resolution to stop using plastic bags, which led to an awareness of other single-use disposable plastic items Beraza had made a simple resolution to stop using plastic bags, which led to an awareness of our dependence on plastic and their impact on the environment. Bag It follows "everyman" Jeb Berrier as he tries to make sense of our dependence on plastic bags. Jeb's journey starts with simple questions: Are plastic bags really necessary? What are plastic bags made from? What happens to plastic bags after they are discarded? What starts as a film about plastic bags evolves into an investigation into plastic and its effect on our waterways, oceans, and even our own bodies.
