Children's/YA Librarian Report (Audrey Snowden):

May saw a return to full in-person programming. We have Toddler Jam on Mondays and Tuesdays, Dungeons & Dragons on Mondays, Environmental Club on Mondays, Among Us (a live Discord meetup) on Tuesdays, It's Story Time! on Wednesdays and Thursdays, Creative Lettering on Wednesdays, and Teen Makerspace Takeovers on the first Friday of the month (the theme was Mother's Day).

We also participate in 1000 Books Before Kindergarten. We participated in Children's Book Week the first week of May and had special take-home activities available each day. I participated in the monthly meeting of SUP Medway, the new anti-drug coalition, on May 12. I made my monthly visit to the middle school on May 16 to bring them a selection of books to display.

I participated virtually in the Translate Gender summer programming planning group, which met weekly throughout May. As a result of those sessions, we will be co-presenting in-person programs, popups, and activities with Medfield Public Library over the summer.
