





Aspiring comedian Raely is the sole survivor of a disastrous train wreck. While faced with the intense grief of losing her best friend, she realizes that someone is following her--and has been following her all her life. Trouble is, no one else can see him. For a ghostly tag-along, Casper's not so bad. He might even be the partner Raely needs to fight the evil spirit hell-bent on destroying her.

Anthony Watkins grew up around Montgomery, and the downtown public library was his home away from home. This is his first return to Montgomery, sharing his work that is so heavily marked by his years in this very building. He is a widely published poet, publisher of a series of literary and arts journals since 1995, including *Scene, Arts of the Treasure Coast, Abundance, A Harvest of Life, Literature & the Arts,* and most recently *Better Than Starbucks*.

Since 2013, a community teaching assistant at the University of Pennsylvania's Modern and Contemporary American Poetry.

Having written and published poetry from an early age, Anthony is a fierce advocate for the everyday aspect of poetry. He believes poetry is for everyone. He organizes free poetry readings and discussions in public libraries, as well as schools, book stores and prisons. This program has previously presented in several counties in Florida.

Everyone in the community with an interest in poetry is invited to come talk about poetry, perhaps share their work. These discussions include his story and experiences publishing poetry as well as some of his poems.

Reviews of his recent collections:

Reading this collection is like finding an album of old photographs. Each one tells a story, often without context, yet they are clearly part of a bigger picture, whole lives well lived. This is poetry utterly without pretense, filled with soul and veined with wry humour. I believe that poems should be worn and dusty, have miles on them, maybe a little barbed wire. I believe that poems should be real. Like these.


