Part of our issue in our library is space limitations, especially in the non-fiction adult area. We do not have a big readership of non-fiction and one of the compromises we have made is that much non-fiction is not purchased until a patron requests an item. If it is a new item, we will purchase, older items we offer to ILL. It has opened up some staff discussions about how to "Balance" the perspective. Our Children's Librarian has almost swung too far. She has done a great job of expanding the collection to represent many different cultural, social ideas, BUT some of the more conservative parents are not happy and some of this material has no circulation interest. Hits the note that this needs to be an ongoing discussion to be revisited frequently to keep our purchases representing all interest groups."
