READS-to-Go Report

Kit Development

Kits that have been recently added include: *Project Hail Mary* (Manchester City Library) and *Rooted* by Lyanda Lynn Haupt (Concord Public Library).

Kits in the process of being added include: *American Dirt* by Jeanine Cummins (Concord Public Library), *Grey Bees* by Andrey Kurkov, and *Underground Railroad* (Bath Public Library). Approved titles waiting for a host include: *Band of Sisters, The Four Winds, The Last Chance Library, Leave the World Behind, Mexican Gothic, The Personal Librarian, The Reading List, The Rose Code, and <i>The Seven Husbands of Evelyn Hugo*.

Approved titles not yet in paperback: *Crying in H Mart, The Lincoln Highway,* and *The Midnight Library*.

NH KitKeeper

Plymouth Rocket has not yet restored the pre-2020 circulation statistics that were omitted from kit records during the restoration process following the server attack of August 11-14. I have asked them to provide a spreadsheet of the data. Plymouth Rocket also explained that their protocol is to backup data offsite nightly.

NELA Presentation

Book Club Kits: READS-to-Go and the NH KitKeeper Program was presented at the NELA Conference by Brianna Hemmah and Martha Simmons on Sunday, October 23. There were 11 in attendance, mostly from other New England states. Nicole Gauvreau of Pease Public Library also attended. She is heavily involved in YALS and CLNH and asked about youth kits and the old On-the-Move book program. She said she would make inquiries to these sections about potential involvement in NH KitKeeper.

YALS, CLNH, and NH KitKeeper

Nicole Gauvreau brought the potential use of NH KitKeeper for youth kits before the CLNH Board at their last meeting. They have opted not to restart the On-the-Move kit program because they do not know where any of the old kits are and they do not want to dedicate the expense and time it would take to obtain bags, produce discussion questions, etc. Nicole will also be bringing the question before the YALS Board on November 17th. She would like to know if it would be possible for a library to host a middle grade or young adult kit on NH KitKeeper without the affiliation of a section.

Reservation Statistics

There were 25 new kit reservations in September, and 12 in October. This is such a substantial drop that I looked deeper into circulation. There are 119 future reservations in the system and 84 for 2023 so far.

The next READS-to-Go meeting is scheduled for December 5th.
