- a. De-deweying. Some libraries have de-Deweyed specific sections such as cookbooks, A/V materials, and YA nonfiction. Some libraries have seen improved circulation.
- b. Library of Things (LOT):
 - i. Hooksett has started circulating board games. They also circulate a Radon detector (Amazon Airthings Corentium Home digital radon detector)
 - ii. Dover organizes their library of things collection with a tag system
 - iii. Goffstown is circulating Hot Spots which are very popular
- c. How do libraries manage book repair? Goffstown has a volunteer who will be starting soon. Other libraries have staff members that were already trained. Sometimes it's easier to simply replace a book rather than investing a lot of time and materials into its repair.
