Term limits for Trustees Question

If the library is a private 501(c) (3) organization [or city library] the authority to set term limits is determined by the terms of the trust or charter. NH RSAs determine the terms of public library trustees, therefore it is not within the authority of a public library trustee board to adopt term limits: **RSA 202-A:6** "... elect a board of library trustees consisting of any odd number of persons which the town may decide to elect. Such trustees shall serve staggered 3-year terms or **until their successors are elected and qualified** ..."

However, within the organization of the board, trustees may adopt a bylaw for the election and terms of officers. Example below:

ARTICLE: OFFICERS AND THEIR DUTIES

Section A: The Officers shall be Chair, Treasurer, and Secretary. The Officers shall be elected annually by majority vote of the Board at its first meeting after the town elections. They shall assume office immediately upon election and may serve for as many terms as elected.

Section B: An Officer may be removed from the position by majority vote of the Board at a regular board meeting or at a special meeting called specifically for that purpose. The position shall be filled at that same meeting.

Section C: Any Officer vacancy that occurs during the year shall be filled by majority vote of the Board at the next regular board meeting or at a special meeting called specifically for that purpose.
