We want our Courageous Communities Conversations (C³) to be centered *here*, in our local communities. We want to respond to the questions and concerns and curiosity our communities already have, and bring the larger, national conversations down to this more intimate, immediate context. That's our strength, as local libraries and educational institutions.

Below is a sort of syllabus for our fall C³. The idea is that participants could join in for as many or as few of the events as they like, on an a la carte basis.

After the first week of foundations and intros, each two week period will address one of our themes. Participants can take in as much of the playlist readings/films/podcasts/interactives as they like. The "Study Group" meetings will be conversations around what people learned from the playlist materials, what questions they raised, and how they're changing us.
