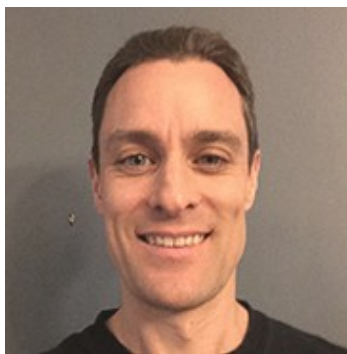

MAPLE, New Hampshire's Medicine of Connection

Few things evoke the identities and values of New Hampshire more than maple syrup. Our presenter explores how the practice of maple sugaring connects us to the land, our ancestors and all that surrounds us, and how sugarmaking—which is informed by indigenous wisdom—is a communal medicine of connection.



Our presenter, Damian Costello, received his PhD in theological studies from the University of Dayton and specializes in the intersection of Catholic theology, Indigenous spiritual traditions, and colonial history. He was born and raised in Vermont and his work is informed by many years of ethnographic work on the Navajo Nation.
