New Hampton Expands Snake River Conservation Area

The New Hampton Conservation Commission has acquired another 5 acre parcel on the west side of the Snake River off Winona Road, with approximately 700 feet of river frontage. The property is a gift to the town from Don and Pat Bergeron in memory of Marilyn J. Bergeron.

The Snake River runs between Winona Lake and Lake Waukewan, and contains wetlands and forested buffers that serve to filter the water entering Lake Waukewan, Meredith's water supply. That lake then drains into Lake Winnipesaukee in Meredith. Protecting the water quality also protects property values in the watershed.

Pending approval from their Board of Selectmen, Meredith will hold a conservation easement on the property, as it does on the rest of the area, monitored by the Meredith Conservation Commission. Two other lots on the New Hampton side of the river were acquired by the New Hampton Conservation Commission in 2010 and 2013. Center Harbor has designated the east side of the Snake River as prime wetlands.

The New Hampton Conservation Commission plans to update its Stewardship Plan for the Snake River Conservation Area to include the Bergeron Property. The plan and its appendices are available online at: http://tinyurl.com/o9juwh9
