Even though it has been over 100 years since its most famous resident arrived by horse and wagon to manage a dual career as poet and poultry farmer on a small plot of New Hampshire land, the Derry home of Robert Frost continues to attract visitors from all over the world. Many places are famous because of Robert Frost, but none played a more vital role in the poet's life than this 30-acre farm with **pasture**, fields, woodlands, orchard and gentle spring.
