The History Corner: "Did Someone Say Snow?"

As a warm-up to our coming wintry season we share some early photos of abundant snowflakes in a variety of "downtown" settings. These were taken in the late 1800s through the 1950s – and include one Fritz Robbins etching of skiers in front of Berry Hall at New Hampton School.
