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The Second Session of the 2024 Town Meeting

The 2nd Session, to vote by official ballot Election of town officers and the warrant articles as they may have been amended at the First Session, will be held at the Town House, 86 Town House Road, New Hampton on **Tuesday, the 12th day of March.**

Polls for voting by official ballot at the Town House will open at
11:00 a.m. and will close at **7:00 p.m.**

Be advised that the Town Clerk/Tax Collector's office will be closed that day as they will be working at the polls.

ROAD POSTINGS

The Town roads in New Hampton will be posted for a 10-ton weight limit by March 1st, if not sooner.

It may be possible for you, or a contractor, to receive a special permit to operate over posted roads for a job or operation for specific dates and times based on weather and road conditions. These permits are available from the Public Works Director Jim Boucher. Opportunities for Individuals in Need

Community Action Program (603-225-3295)

The primary mission of the organization is to work with low-income families and older people to assist them in their efforts to become or remain both financially and socially independent

in their communities. Programs and services are designed to meet the needs of children, families, single parents, older people, and the disabled.

Mid-State Transit (603-225-1989)

Mid-State Transit provides origin-to-destination transportation for seniors (60+) and adults with disabilities in Belknap and Merrimack Counties – outside of the Concord area.

Transport Central (1-855-654-3200)

Transport Central is a not-for-profit organization committed to increasing the mobility for seniors, individuals with disabilities and those on Medicaid by providing non-emergency medical transportation

Check-in Program for our Residents at-risk

“Good Morning New Hampton” is a scheduled check-in program with the New Hampton Fire Department to assist our at-risk population; the elderly population, those with special needs who live alone, or residents who live with others unable to effectively communicate that help is needed. It will allow those with limited support to maintain their independence for as long as possible. It is also helpful to those that have recently been released from the hospital or a rehabilitation facility. This program allows family, friends, and/or neighbors the added comfort of knowing that the individual is having regular contact with local personnel.
