New Hampton's Winona District is bordered by Ashland, Center Harbor and Meredith. In some ways, it developed as a separate community from the Town of New Hampton. It had its own school, tavern, hotel, Masonic Hall, lake-side resort, blacksmith shop, town pound, general store, post office and railroad station. Lake Winona is the geographic center of the State. The program provides a history of the development of this community and the Boston & Maine Railroad's significant role in this development. Gordon DuBois, Winona District resident and NHHS Vice-President, will use slides and historic documents to tell the story of this unique community.

Our events are free and open to the public. Light refreshments will be served, along with fundraising items for sale.
