Bald Ledge Hike Saturday, September 22, 2012, 9:30am

Sky Pond Boat Launch and Parking area (there is limited parking so please call and let us know you are coming and car pool if possible!)

Hope you all will join us on the Conservation Commission hike to Bald Ledge, this Saturday, Sept 22 at 9:30. It's about a 25 minute walk to and fro, starting at Sky Pond in New Hampton, elevation 1000' and after some hilly walking on an old logging road and an open walking/snowmobile trail one comes to an opening on top of a ledge at 1220' and approximately 700' above Lake Winona. From that point on a clear day, one can see

from Cannon Mt and the Notch (tree limbs permitting), Mts Liberty and Lafayette, Twin Mt, and some Presidential Mountains, Loon/Waterville, Whiteface, Chocorua, the Ossippees & Moose, and all the way to Alton. And still Lake Winona, the Snake (or Mosquito) River, Hawkins Pond, Squam Lake, Lake Waukewan and a couple of bays of Winnipesaukee to Wolfeboro and Alton, the last a bit iffy. Perhaps you will come help us map it all. This was also the site of New Hampton's <u>first</u> Old Home Day and this related to me by Lora Torsey at 101years of age that she was by an attendee as an infant at the time! And there is an old cellar hole (1828-1880), the Orlando Huckins homestead.

Directions:

From the north, in Ashland take Winona Road to right turn onto Dana Hill Road where one goes over a railroad bridge. Continue on Dana Hill Road to Lower Ox Bow Rd on the left. Follow Lower Ox Bow to Sky Pond Road on the left. Continue on Sky Pond Road to the Sky Pond parking area and public boat launch.

From the South, take Route 104 to Town House Road, turn into Dana Hill Rd and continue a few miles to the Lower Ox Bow Rd on the left to Sky Pond Road on left. Continue on Sky Pond Road to the Sky Pond Parking Area and public boat launch.

Trailhead Sign "Bald Ledge Trail" (crafted by Doug Smith) is just outside parking area on the left on the Class VI, Beech Hill, Road (an extension of Sky Pond Rd) and where we will muster ... 1085' elevation.

The walk is 400' to a gate, 1000' to a blaze and arrow on the right and within 100 yds, the full panorama ... walk each way, easy to moderate (a bit up and down). Sturdy shoes, a water bottle are suggested and a walking stick is helpful.

Please let me know if you will be attending, so we wait for you....744-5671, c603-344-5770.

Look forward to hearing from you. We've heard from one town person, whose knapsack is packed and he has been practicing his yodeling ... sounds like a great day. Join us!
