is related to child care. There are federal guidelines that protect their jobs and will be paid during a leave. There are two parts of the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA). The first is a two-week paid leave (100% for full-time and 75% for part-time). The second is a 12 week leave, with the first two-weeks unpaid and 10 weeks paid (100% for full time and 75% for part-time). There are 6 specific conditions outlined to qualify. Director Hoadley will look into the specifics of the FFCRA. In the reopening plan for the library, there is a minimum staffing level required of two people in the building.
