SPL Website Forms

Our website includes a number of forms for direct access to popular library services. These forms are located on the 'How Do I' and 'Services' tabs on the Library's **website**. Please note - in order for staff to best serve patrons, forms should be completed in full.

Suggest a Purchase. We are happy to accept suggestions from SPL patrons to purchase items for our collections. Please note that your library card number is required so that we may place your hold on the requested item.

Complete the **Suggest a Program** form if you would like to present a program at the Library, or to suggest a program or presenter for our consideration.

To enroll in the ESOL program, complete the **Learn English** form. Your information will be sent to the ESOL Coordinators at Stoughton Public Library who will contact you directly.

The Cynthia B. Fox Community Room is a general-purpose meeting room that is available free of charge to non-profit organizations for educational, recreational, and civic purposes. For-profit organizations must pay a fee of \$50 per request. All requests must be made via the Reserve the Community Room form. The Director must approve all requests.

The Library has designated spaces for the display of artwork in the Community Room and other areas of the building. Prior to completing the **Request to Exhibit** form, please come in to the Library to see if our spaces will work for you.

Curbside Pickup is available by reservation to patrons who complete the form.

Sharon cardholders may request to borrow items from outside the OCLN network by submitting the **Interlibrary Loan** request form in 'Borrow from Other Libraries'.

The Sharon Sanitarium for Pulmonary Diseases

Sharon is well known for being naturally beautiful. Now consider if that beauty were believed to cure illness. As unusual as that may seem, in the late 1800s when Tuberculosis (TB) was running rampant throughout Europe and the United States, that's exactly what people thought. It was hypothesized that clean air, naturesque landscapes, fresh groundwater and lots of rest were the best ways to cure pulmonary illnesses.
