Out of the Archives



In preparation for the new Library, we have embarked on a project to organize our local history archival collection. Some very interesting items are being unearthed and will be featured as part of this monthly newsletter by our Archivist, Arielle Nathanson.

This month's feature is:

Spring Cleaning is Headstone Cleaning!

The Local History Room houses a large stack of papers detailing epitaphs from some of the local cemeteries. This item is great, because many older headstones aren't as hardy as the ones currently made out of granite. Most markers from one hundred to two hundred years ago were typically made out of slate or marble (though a few were made from zinc). Slate tends to flake apart easily due to moisture. Rain and snow saturate the stone and either soften or end up splitting it when the temperature drops. Marble is only slightly different. It tends to be porous and delicate, once again making it susceptible to moisture and general wear. Knowing this, it's a wonder that any of the older headstones are still around today! However, the future is not dark for all of our historical markers. Many times they can benefit greatly from a simple cleaning. Removing all the moss, lichen and other debris can keep fragile stones from wearing away. Moisture from weather is always an issue, but with constant upkeep many stones can last much longer[...]


social media since 2010, providing a safe and friendly environment for book lovers around the globe.


