Photography and Videography

Camera phones, apps and filters have definitely made photographing and sharing our lived experiences very fast and easy. But, if you want to really understand the art and science of photography and gain more creative control over your image making, you will want to get your hands on a DSLR (Digital Single Lens Reflex) camera.

The Canon EOS Rebel T7i is an easy-to-use, yet powerful camera, well – equipped to take your creative still and motion imaging to the next level. Whether you are using a DSLR for the first time, honing your manual photographic techniques, or producing your own VLOG, the Rebel T7i can help you produce professional grade projects.

Getting Started

For still photography, there are two modes for shooting: *automatic presets* and *manual*

Automatic settings: Portrait, Landscape, Close-Up, etc. can be chosen based on your needs

Manual Settings: if you are looking to control the image's exposure and/or depth of field more precisely, f-stops and shutter speeds can be selected manually (if you are not familiar with these concepts, see the Helpful Resources and Online Resources sections and/or the camera manual to learn more)

ISO: Indoor set to 400

Autofocus: set

White Balance Setting: set to auto

For videography, the use of a tripod will be determined by your project's needs: if you want to record yourself or someone else for an instructional video, a tripod will be essential for minimizing camera shake. If you are interested in tracking a subject's movement and providing various camera angles, hand holding the camera may be better


Next Steps

For example: if you need to photograph 10 small objects for a brochure that you are designing, it will be easier to create a stationary studio setup with a tripod, lights and green screen, and just swap out objects after each is shot.




