Budget

Trustee Board Chairman Dick Whitney and I met with Town Manager and Chief Financial Officer
to discuss the FY2021 budget, on 2/19. Currently the requested amount is \$550,036.00 but the
discussion is not yet complete. The focus of the discussion was the books and materials budget –
a mandatory minimum of 15% of the MAR to meet the state aid requirement.

Building

- The heat exchanger for the roof top unit #2 needs to be replaced. MPC awarded the contract and they will install as soon as the part is replacement unit is available.
- Elevator Maintenance Service has repaired the two items that were identified in the inspection conducted by the state 1/10. State will inform us of the re-inspection date. Office of Public Safety conducted an administrative review on 1/27 and has waived the fine previously imposed.
- Working on the draft invitation to bid for the installation of copper gutters on the west side of the building.
- Request for Quote has been approved by the Town Manager. Three architectural firms were contacted to work on the repair of the ceilings throughout the building.
