

Report presented to the Board of Trustees by Margaret Morrissey, Director June 27, 2023

Budget

The end of the fiscal year is 6/30.

Building

- Globe Signs has started the project to refurbish the exterior JEL mahogany signs.
- The door handle at the North entrance is malfunctioning. Locksmith has repaired the lock. We are looking to replace the door locks in FY2024.
- New vinyl floor installed in the craft room 6/22.
- Since 6/14 we have been experiencing intermittent issues with the elevator. The Elevator
 Maintenance Service has been here on many occasions and working on the issues as they
 present themselves. The budget line item for building and equipment maintenance has already
 been exceeded and other funding such as state aid will be needed.

Children's Room

- New displays thematically linked to the season were installed.
- Programs offered in addition to the regular Story Time (Wednesdays and Fridays), Lego Club, Crafty Wednesdays, STEAM and others.
- Young Scientists Spring II programs part of YFCP has been very successful.
- Wiggles and Giggles program returns to the library, due to its record success.
- Staff is busy working on Summer Reading and decorating the room to be a welcoming place. Staff has been liaising with the elementary schools for recommended reading lists and programs to encourage reading during the summer.
- Summer Reading kick-off on June 26 with Maggie The Clown 55 attended.

Collection Development

• A 35 mm film was found in the Holmes Ammidown History Room and Archive in a can with a brief note indicating it was of Sacred Heart Church. On further investigation by Councilor Mike Marketti and Paul Zotos, it was a professional movie "Exclusive Pictures Taken for the Strand Theatre by Central Motion Picture Co. C.L. Raimondo Photographer". The film was thought to be in poor condition and it was vacuumed and is not deteriorated. I have spoken with Anthony Labbate, Preservation Manager at the Eastman Museum. He gave a general quote of \$4,070 for a 4k scan which would include editing and color correction. He was encouraging about the

- results we could anticipate from this process. The funding for the project has been provided by Southbridge Historical Commission \$400.25 and Savers Bank have offered to cover the remaining cost. The film is packaged and ready for pick up by a courier service.
- The digitized 8 mm home movies of Eugene Livernois have been uploaded by SCTV to YouTube. We are working on the descriptive metadata.
- The weeding in the Teen fiction and Adult nonfiction continues

FOJEL

- Coffee Service machine is being replaced. The Friends are buying a Keurig 2500 machine through WB Mason and will have a service contract with them. Awaiting delivery and installation.
- Funding provided for the Gender Wellness Initiative (Zoom) presentation from Seven Hills \$100 on 6/21. Offered by Joshua Hyde, Charlton and JEL jointly.
- Funding provided for Sarah Jo Burke's concert Pride in Southbridge on 6/29
- The Friends provided the funding for the incentive prizes for Summer Reading \$300.

Garden

- Opacum Land Trust visited the site and confirmed they will provide a replacement tree as part of the 1,000 Tree Project, most likely a dogwood.
- One of the petunia plants was stolen from the urn on Main Street. It was replaced with a similarly colored impatience plant.

Grants and Donations

- A request for funding to convert the 35 mm Sacred Heart/The Strand movie to digital format
 was sent to various financial institutions in the area and the Historical Commission for
 consideration.
- Southbridge Historical Commission is contributing \$400.25 to the digitizing project. In process.
- Savers Bank has offered to cover the remaining balance.

Local History

• The 8 mm films recently digitized have been uploaded to YouTube by SCTV and we are working on metadata to provide a more granular description.

Long Range Plan

• Senior staff worked on the plan and the data component. The fifth draft was circulated to the board in advance of the meeting for review and comment.

- Participated in the Community Reading Day at Eastford Road School 5/26
- YFCP Young Scientists & Wiggles and Giggles returns for the month of June. It is a very busy and fun program.
