ARIS (Annual Report of Information Statistics)

- The statistical report, part of the state aid process is underway. Due for submission August 26, 2022

ARPA

- Scheduled to meet with the committee 8/4 to discuss technology needs at the library.

Building

- Parking lot - vegetation cut and area cleaned up over many days. Wood chips spread 7/19.
- Three contractors were contacted for a quote for the memorial donation of the Notre Dame School stained glass transom installation. Ernie Morse conducted a second site visit 7/14 and Dennis Tucker of Brunarhans 7/21, to review the project with a view to submitting a quote. Awaiting response from Cronin Cabinetmakers.
- Mike Garon electrician here 7/21 to review the lighting needs – grant from the Southbridge Cultural Council.
- Casella has changed our trash collection day to Wednesdays.
- Punch list is being updated to identify the building related projects.

Children's Room

- 91 kiddos are signed up for the Summer Reading Program
- Ricardo Frota and Ecology of Sound event 7/12 an afternoon program
- Strong response is being received to the programs on Monday evenings. 69 people attended the Animal Adventures event 7/25.

Grant

- Grassroots Climate Group – offered funding for thematically related books that staff would select.
- Illumination of sculpture – LCC grant of \$3,000 awarded by Southbridge Cultural Council, working on a scope of service.
- ARPA grant – request for funding for technology. Initially we looked at cabling but now reviewing fiber optic connection.

- Area Librarians met on 7/13 to discuss items of mutual interest
- Christmas in July – the knitting group presented New Hope with handmade hats, scarves etc. for their clients. A donation to St. Luke’s is pending.

- Aldrich Astronomical Society with Dino Tata and Jim Zebrowski presented a program on the images from the James Webb Telescope that have recently become available, on 7/14
