Budget

Meeting with Interim Town Manager, Assistant Town Manager and Executive Assistant to the Town Manager 3/16 and budget request of \$574,884.00 presented.

Building

- DPW assisted with access to the Bustracker to resume internet connection. Also hung a framed photograph
- Bay Path Instructor Justin Verham and electrical department students visited the library to review some small electrical projects 3/9. They are able to perform the work requested and a letter has been sent to the School Committee to formally request the project be assigned.
- DPW installed a new driver and tube light in the YA light fixture and replaced the bulb in the
- parking lot light 3/9.
- Request for proposals sent to three vendors to have the two mahogany signs refurbished. Globe Signs presented the lowest bid \$3,000 and plan on starting the project 3/31
- Norel Services conducted the semi annual check of the fire system. There were some items that need correction and the team will return 4/5 to correct the deficiencies
- Sought the assistance of the Health Department Director regarding a patron, having received some complaints from patrons 3/15.

Collection Development

- A 35 mm film was found in the Holmes Ammidown History Room and Archive in a can with a brief note indicating it was of Sacred Heart Church. On further investigation by Councillor Mike Marketti and Paul Zotos, it was a professional movie "Exclusive Pictures Taken for the Strand Theatre by Central Motion Picture Co. C.L. Raimondo Photographer". The film was thought to be in poor condition and it was vacuumed and is not deteriorated.
- The weeding in the Teen fiction and Adult nonfiction continues
- Publishers Weekly reports that ALA has recorded a challenges of 2,571 unique titles "a stunning 38% increase from the 1,858 unique titles targeted for censorship in 2021". Article shared with the board by email. The figure was 377 challenges in 2019.
