

How it works:

- **SIGN UP!** Visit us online at https://suttonpubliclibrary.beanstack.org
 (you can find the link on our website too) or scan the QR code to sign up
 using our Beanstack program. If you're registering a family we recommend
 registering an adult first and then adding family members. We are using the
 same software as we did last summer, so you can use the same login and
 password as you did then. Having trouble logging in or setting up an
 account? Drop by the Library or give us a call at 508-865-8752 and we'll
 figure it out with you. You get 5 tickets just for registering! Tickets are virtual
 and appear in your Beanstack account.
- READ! Over the course of the program, log the time you are reading or are being read to (in minutes). You earn 1 ticket for every 60 minutes of time logged.
- **EARN MORE TICKETS!** You can earn extra tickets by completing challenge activities and/or writing book reviews to increase your chances to win!
- **ENTER RAFFLES!** All the prizes are physically on display at the Library and viewable on Beanstack. You can enter the raffles by putting your tickets in the virtual raffle buckets on Beanstack. The last day to enter the raffle is Friday, August 9 before 6 pm.
