We had a fabulous summer here at the Library! There were 294 kids, 111 teens, and 164 adults registered for summer reading! Participants logged a combined total of 595,899 minutes— that’s 414 days worth of reading in 8 weeks!

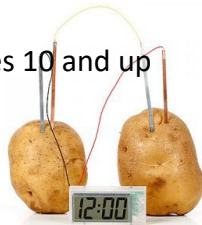
