

Homebound Delivery Program Launches


The Library is proud to announce the launch of our Homebound Delivery program. This is a free service available to Sutton residents who are temporarily or permanently housebound and their caregivers.

We will be ready to deliver to you on July 2, 2018! We have been busy ordering supplies, and training staff and volunteers who will deliver materials to you according to your individual requests. Service can be arranged on a short or long-term basis. To sign up for this service, application forms can be found on our website, or picked up at the Library and the Sutton Senior Center. Please call us with any questions you may have about this program. The start-up costs of this service have been funded by a grant from the Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners.


Box it up!
