As data is transferred to Koha from August 1-4, we will experience small service disruptions. During these few days, we will be unable to see real-time patron or item information. We will also be unable to check in returned items or place holds for you. This interruption should only last a few days until we resume normal operations. Our HQ has confirmed that there will be no disruptions in online or streaming services during these few days. As soon as Koha is live, our priority will be to account for all items returned during this period. In order to ensure accuracy on Monday, August 5, our first day with the new software, we will be opening at 1pm. We thank you in advance for your patience and appreciate your support as the staff begins the journey of mastering the new software to better serve the community.

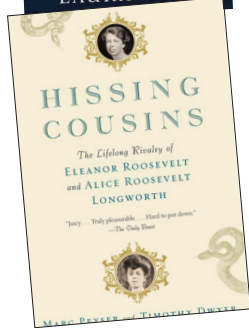

Join us on the first Friday of every month for a lively discussion of great books. Books available one month prior to discussion date. All discussions take place in-person at the Library.



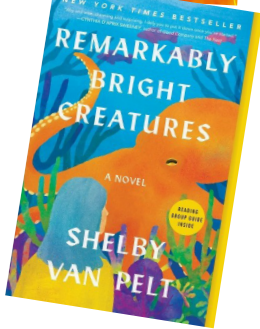
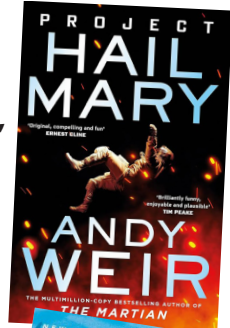

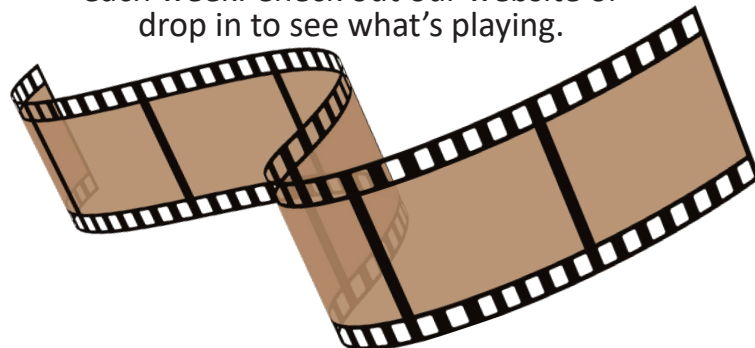
There have been 19 weddings held at the White House over the last 200 years. We will look at their history, see where the ceremonies were held, how each was celebrated and learn little about the happy couples.

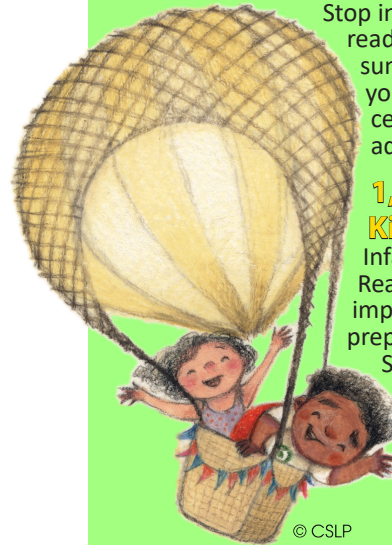
