Historic District Scavenger Hunt

Tappan's Historic District was established to preserve and maintain the many historic symbols of the past. Using the map, locate one of the Historic Area designation signs.

1. Land Patents were granted to sixteen families by the Tappan Indians and the Governor of New York. What year was the patent for Tappan issued?

A. DeWint House Grounds: The DeWint House was used as George Washington's headquarters several times during the Revolutionary War. The Masons acquired the house, and it is now a museum dedicated to the American people as a shrine of patriotism and an altar of citizenship. Find the dedication sign at the entrance to the property.

2. The Masons designated this site as a memorial to George Washington. What year was it?

3. What year was the DeWint House built?

4. What year was the Carriage House built?

Enter the Carriage House. In the front parlor, find the tools on the left side of the room:

5. What is the "C" shaped tool used for?

In the rear parlor, find the authentic model of a sailing vessel. The ship was the meeting place of General Washington and Sir Carlton, Commander of the British Armies. They met to discuss the peace treaty between the two countries.

Walk towards the DeWint House:

8. Locate the Well Sweep. What purpose did this serve?

9. Locate the blue flag with 13 white stars. What did this flag represent?

- 10. Find the Franklin Alatamaha tree. This species was discovered in 1765 by Philadelphia botanist John Bartram and named after his great friend. Who it named in honor of?
- 11. Find the Mill Stone. What was it used for?
- 12. Locate the burial markers from the slave burial grounds. Where were the markers originally found?

Trial of Major John Andre: Major John Andre of the British Army and General Benedict Arnold of the American Continental Army conspired to provide the British with the plans for West Point during the American Revolutionary War. Andre was captured and tried for his involvement. Benedict Arnold fled and never was punished for his crimes against his nation.

B. The '76 House (The Mabie House): This structure was built in 1755 by Casparus Mabie. It has been used as a tavern since the 18th century.

- 13. What was this building used for during the Revolutionary War?
- 14. Go inside the restaurant. Find the fireplace where the portrait of Benedict Arnold hangs on the right side. What is unusual about this portrait?

C. Tappan Reformed Church and Old Burial Ground: The original church was established by the earliest settlers of Tappan. The second church which stood on this site was used for Andre's trial. This building is the third church on this site. It contains several plaques and signs.

15. What year was the original church on this site established?

16. What year was Major Andre tried and convicted of spying?

17. What date was the current church built?

- Go to the Old Burial Ground. Many Tappan residents who experienced the tragic tale of Major Andre are buried in this section.
- 18. Find the gravestone of Cornelius Bogert. How old was he when Major Andre was tried and hanged in Tappan?
- **D. Tappan Village Green:** This was the site of the first Orange County courthouse and jail.
- 19. Look at the plaque in front of the flag pole. Who does it commemorate?
- 20. Why was he important?
- 21. What was the first courthouse built of?

E. The Manse: The Manse was built in 1729 and it is the oldest parsonage in continuous use in the U.S. It was built by the Reverend Samuel Verbryck, friend of George Washington.

23. What else was he responsible for establishing?

F. Andre Monument: Either walk or drive to Andre Hill, the monument that marks the site of Andre's hanging on October 2, 1780. Several smaller markers, one just a pile of stones, were erected on the site before the present one erected in 1879 by Cyrus Field.

G. Tappan Memorial Park: The Tappan Memorial Park was created in 1971 by the Town of Orangetown, its residents and local contractors. It was designed by landscape architect Bernard Albin. Originally, the site was about to become a shopping center, when the Tappan Civic Association urged the town to purchase the site for a park, which it did in 1966. Construction began in 1971, and the park was dedicated in May, 1972.

28. Tito Puente was a world-renowned musician specializing in Latin-Jazz music. He was a long-time resident of Tappan, and his children went to school in the SOCSD. When he died, a tree was planted in the park in his honor. Find the plaque beneath this tree. How many years did he live in Tappan?

H. Tappan Library: The present site of the Tappan Library at 93 Main Street was originally a home and store.

The latest addition to the library was built for use by patrons of Borcher's Hotel, which is now II Portico Restaurant.
